Bennington is in the 911 CARES program, which allows individuals to register specific medical conditions under their phone number. If you ever need to call 911 from one of the registered phones, the 911 dispatcher would be able to see the name, physical address (not necessarily the location of the caller) and medical conditions of the CARES individual and relay that information to the first responders before they arrive on scene.

If the program sounds familiar... 911 CARES is the new name of the revamped Supplemental ALI Medical Information database. *If you previously participated in the SupALI program, you still must register with a new account and CARES individual information with 911CARES.* To confirm your registration in the 911CARES system, contact NH911CARES@desc.nh.gov.

How Does It Work? When we receive a call from a number associated with a CARES individual, the medical condition(s) and other information submitted by the account holder is displayed on the 911 telecommunicator's screen and can be shared with first responders, so they have a better understanding of the emergency situation, before they arrive on scene.

Where Do I Sign Up? The 911CARES database is accessible by going to: <http://www.cares.desc.nh.gov>. If you do not have access to a computer or the internet, paper forms can be requested by calling: 603-271-6911, option 4.



COMMUNITY POWER PLAN:

The Town of Bennington is moving forward on a Community Power plan.

Community Power is a program approved by the State Legislature that allows towns to buy power, at rates that are lower than utilities' rates. The Town thus becomes the power supplier for residents and businesses. The purpose of this program is to lower energy costs in the town of Bennington. The plan will need Town Meeting approval. Once approved, we will be able to bring the energy to all residents and businesses that choose to participate, at a competitive price.

NEW EMPLOYEE

Effective October 1, Selectmen authorized the hiring of Curtis Dude. Curtis was hired as a full-time employee, working 20 hours with the Highway Department and 20 hours at the Transfer Station. Curtis will be the newest friendly face you see at the Transfer Station and will be able to assist you with any questions. Curtis lives in Bennington with his wife and their dog.

TAX RATE

The tax rate has seen an overall increase of \$0.50. The Town portion increased by .23, State education increased .54, the County increased .04, and Local Education decreased \$0.31, from the 2022 rate.

WHITTEMORE LAKE UPDATE

Whittemore Lake was resampled November 16, 2023. Unfortunately, the cyanobacteria density continues to exceed the state limit of 70,000 cell/mL so the advisory will remain active. The highest observed density was 91,800 cells/mL near the dam. Other samples collected from around the lake ranged from 28,500 - 32,000 cells/mL.
