FIRE DEPARTMENT

IT'S THE LAW, FIRE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED!

 Burning of category II and III Fires is allowed between 5:00PM and 9:00AM, unless it is actively raining.

- Landowner permission is required in writing to obtain a legal permit.
- Category I fires must be at 25 feet from structures or other hazards.
- Category II and III fires must be at 50 feet from structures or other hazards.
- You must obtain a seasonal permit for your fire pit or cooking fire annually.
- Brush piles require their own permit (you cannot use your seasonal permit), the permitted shall have sufficient water, tools and personnel necessary to control and completely extinguish the fire.
- Permissible materials are clean, untreated wood and brush 5 inches in diameter or less.
- **NO** domestic waste, treated wood or composite materials may be burned.
 - RSA -125N defines "combustible domestic waste" as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted or treated wood, coated or treated cardboard, oily rags and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
- A complete copy of the laws and regulations can be a complete copy of the laws and regulations can be obtained at the fire station, from the fire warden or one of the deputy fire wardens.

PLEASE NUMBER YOUR HOUSE, APARTMENT, CAMP & MAILBOX

It is extremely important that when you call for help, that we can find you quickly. Please help us help you.

- Number your mailbox with large and reflective numbers.
- Number your residence with large and reflective numbers that are easily seen from the road.
- If you are in a camp or apartment, it is very important to number your entry door.
- When calling 911, give as much detail as to your location as possible.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The State of New Hampshire office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management recently visited Bennington to evaluate our programs and have given us a GOLD STAR rating. With the exception of one plan which is in the middle of being updated, we are at or in most cases above the state averages from all agencies including those which are full time.

AED PROGRAM

The Town of Bennington has purchased AEDs to place in many town buildings including, both police vehicles, multiple fire vehicles, town office, gym upstairs at town office, library, transfer station/highway department and the VFW. Training will be provided for CPR and AED to all town employees and a program for residents is coming soon.

Low to Moderate Income Tax Relief – The State of NH offers a low to moderate income tax relief program. The Town can help you through the program, the forms will become available at the end of April. Call the office and speak with either Deb or Cathy who are happy to help you complete the paperwork that may provide you a little relief from the state. An eligible applicant for the Low and Moderate Income Homeowners Property Tax Relief is a person who is: Single with adjusted gross income equal to or less than \$37,000; or. Married or head of NH household with adjusted gross income less than or equal to \$47,000;
